Summer is here and in the last few days its intensity has increased. This season also brings with it various health related issues, which each should pay attention to. We should also take precaution against the most probable sicknesses. Given below are few tips on how one can take care of one's health at home.

Given below are few tips on how one can take care of one's health at home.

- In the morning, after you brush your teeth, put two drops of ghee made from cow's milk or coconut oil in your nostrils.
 This is called 'Nasya', which helps in reducing the heat in the head and eyes.
- We should avoid spicy, tasty, stale, salty and fried food. Similarly, we should also keep away from sour food such as, aamchur, pickles, tamarind, etc.
- 3. We should also not consume cold drinks, ice creams and fruit juices, which use chemicals and preservatives to increase their shelf life; as such things reduce our digestion and also lead to skin diseases.
- 4. We should include liquid food items in our diet such as juices of raw mango (kairi panhe), jeera, sour lime and other fruits, coconut water, rice kheer made with milk, gulkhand. This will help in protecting our bodies against the sun's heat.
- 5. Drink sufficient water, to quench your thirst caused by excessive heat.
- 6. Use loose cotton clothes, keep your hair clean and do not use plastic slippers.
- 7. If you need to go out in the hot sun, drink water before you leave. Use a cap and sun glasses to protect your head and eyes from the sun.
- When you come from the sun back into a cooler environment, do not drink water immediately, but drink it only after 10-15 minutes.
- In these hot days, cold water from the fridge and cooler can damage your throat, teeth and intestines. You should drink plain water or from a 'matka'.
- 10. We should avoid extra exercise, fasting, work, roaming in the sun, suppressing our hunger pangs and thirst, etc.
- 11. If you feel excess heat or get crack in the soles of your feet, you should apply 'mehendi'.

'Portability' in Graduation

Today during the course of Graduation, students are not able to change their University. However, with Universities across the country agreeing for the implementation of the 'Choice Based Credit Transfer System', this facility will soon be made available to them.

Virtual Classroom in Colleges

Virtual Classrooms are useful for students. The Minister for Technical & Higher Education has informed the concerned Officials to prepare these classrooms in all Government Medical Colleges in the State of Maharashtra.

Entrance for Medical & Engineering through MH-CET

Admission for Medical, Management and Engineering course for the academic year 2016 will be granted only through the State Common Entrance Test, that is MH-CET. The colleges will not be permitted to conduct their own Exams and will have to depend on MH-CET only.

Educational Joint Venture with Israel

An announcement was made by the Maharashtra Government and the Consular Officials of the Israeli Embassy that they will co-operate in developing the educational system and improving the standard of higher education in Maharashtra.

Exam Centre to be close to residence
