

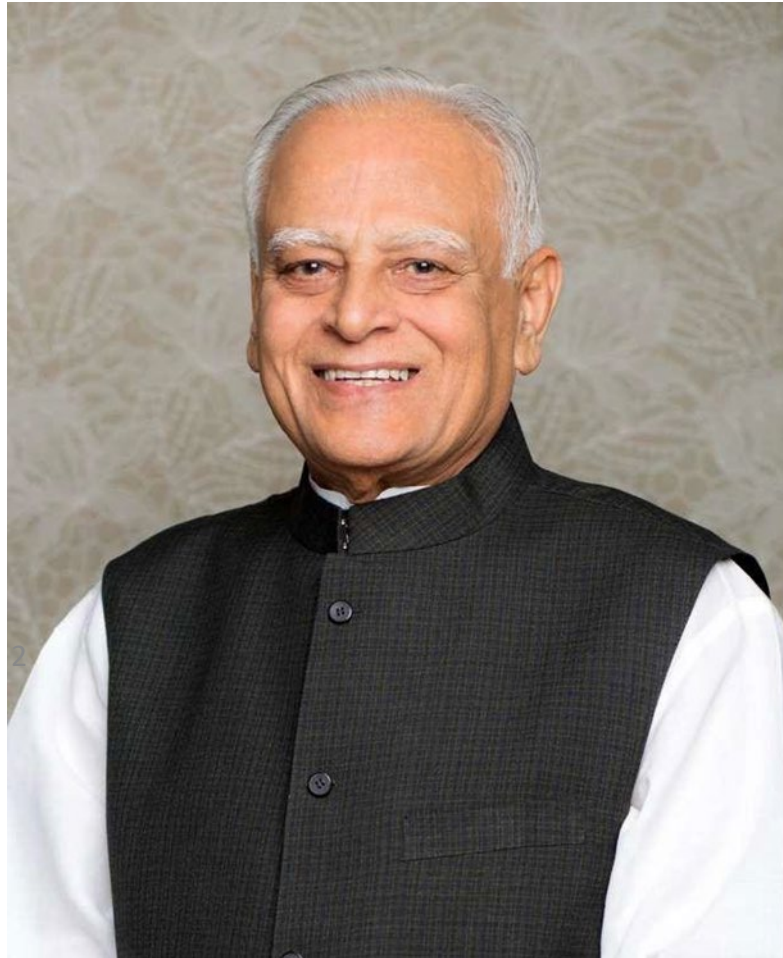


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Our Inspiration

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Background

- Our inspiration Shri Sureshdada Jain, a renowned personality of Maharashtra, has been tirelessly working to bring about a transformational change in the field of politics, education, social harmony, public health, inclusive culture and holistic development.
- The **‘Suresh Dada Scheme for Educational and Entrepreneurial Development (SD-SEED)’** was launched in 2008 to provide Scholarship, training and other student-centric benefits to economically challenged students, who have shown great academic potential of Jalgaon District.
- SD-SEED is ably guided by Dada's wife, Smt. Ratna Jain, as Chairperson, Ms. Meenakshi Jain, Executive President and Dr. Prasannakumar Redasani, Chairman of the Governing Board, which comprises of 30 eminent personalities, who form the Advisory and Selection Committee.
- This Committee thoroughly scrutinizes and screens each application, in order to ascertain the applicant's eligibility and also visit the student's residence for verification, thus ensuring that the right student is awarded the scholarship.
- Since 2008, over 14,682 students of the district have benefited from scholarships.
- 3,568 students have completed their education.
- 44,960 students (approx.) have been trained in Soft Skills Development & other -19 topics.



Map of Maharashtra with Jalgaon



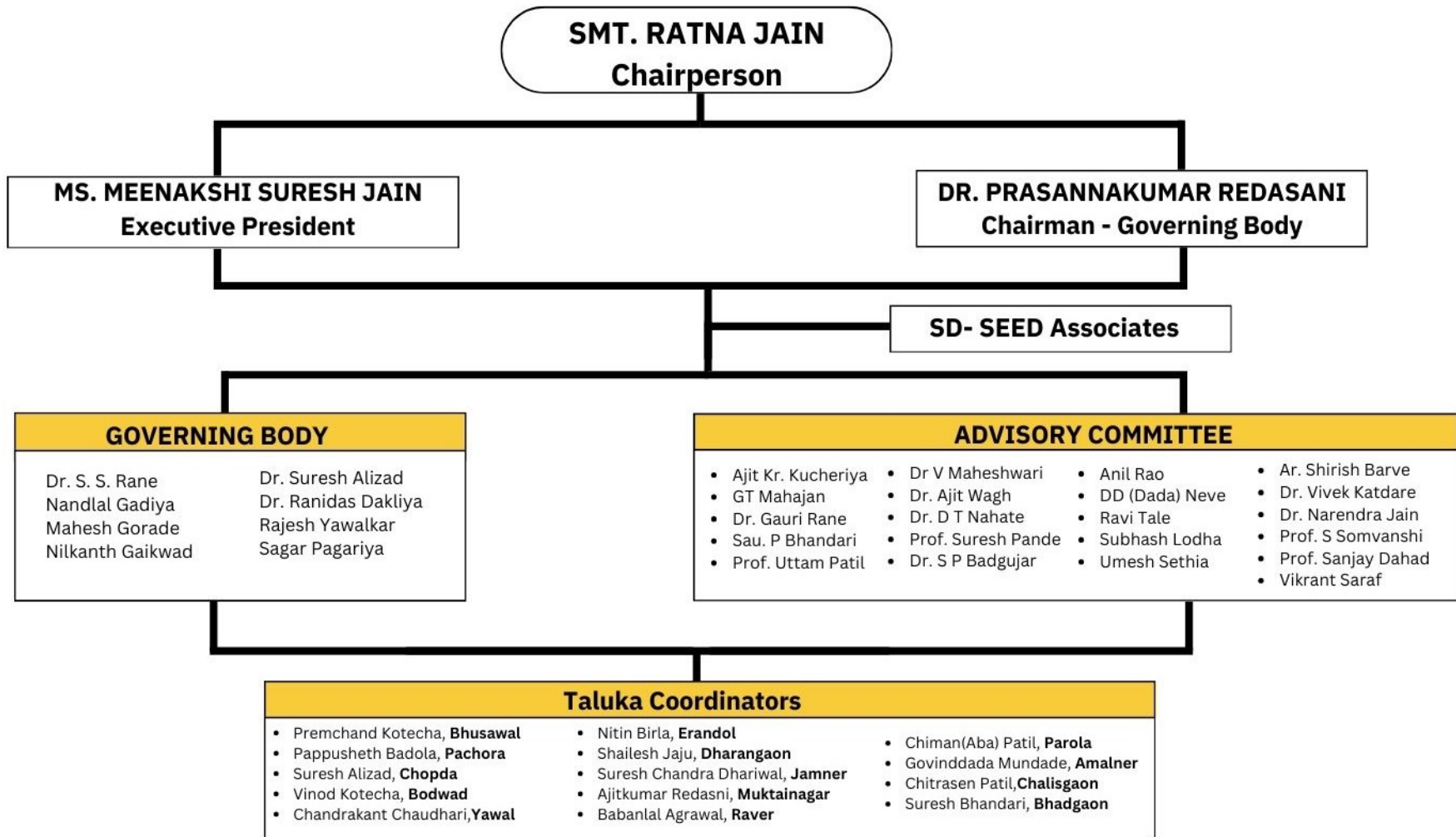

Selection Criteria for NEW Applications:

- Student should be resident of Jalgaon District
- Passed Std. 10th and above exams in the first attempt
- Combined annual income of the family should be less than Rs. 2 Lacs
- Physically challenged students will get special preference
- Eligibility Percentage

Our Flagship Program

‘Matoshri Premabai Jain Higher Education Scholarship’

Selection criteria for **RENEWAL** applications :

- Students who has given scholarship in previous years including drop outs.
- Student should clear and pass previous exams
- Beneficiary may have ATKT in only one subject
- **Eligibility criteria**
 - a) Std. 12th to Degree (1st year): Min. 75%
 - b) Diploma (3rd Year) to Degree : Min 75%
 - c) Degree to Post Graduation : Min. 75%
- Combined annual income of the family should be less than Rs. 2 Lacs
- Special preference will be given to Physically challenged / Orphan Beneficiaries



Adoption Scholarship Program & Giving Back Scholarship Program

- Many individuals and organizations have expressed their heartfelt desire to collaborate with us in noble cause of awarding scholarship to economically challenged students, who have shown great academic potential, hence the '**Adoption Scholarship Program**' was started.
- Many of our Alumni Beneficiaries also have shown deep sense of gratitude to give back to SD-SEED either by financial support or by gives their time for teaching or guiding students, hence the '**Giving Back Scholarship Program**' was launched.
- The selection criteria for the above two scholarships is as per 'Matoshri Premabai Jain Scholarship' and scrutiny is done by same Selection Committee.
- Based on educational stream, a student can be given a scholarship from Rs.5,000 to Rs.65,000 per year.
- Beneficiaries online progress report of all beneficiary is maintained.

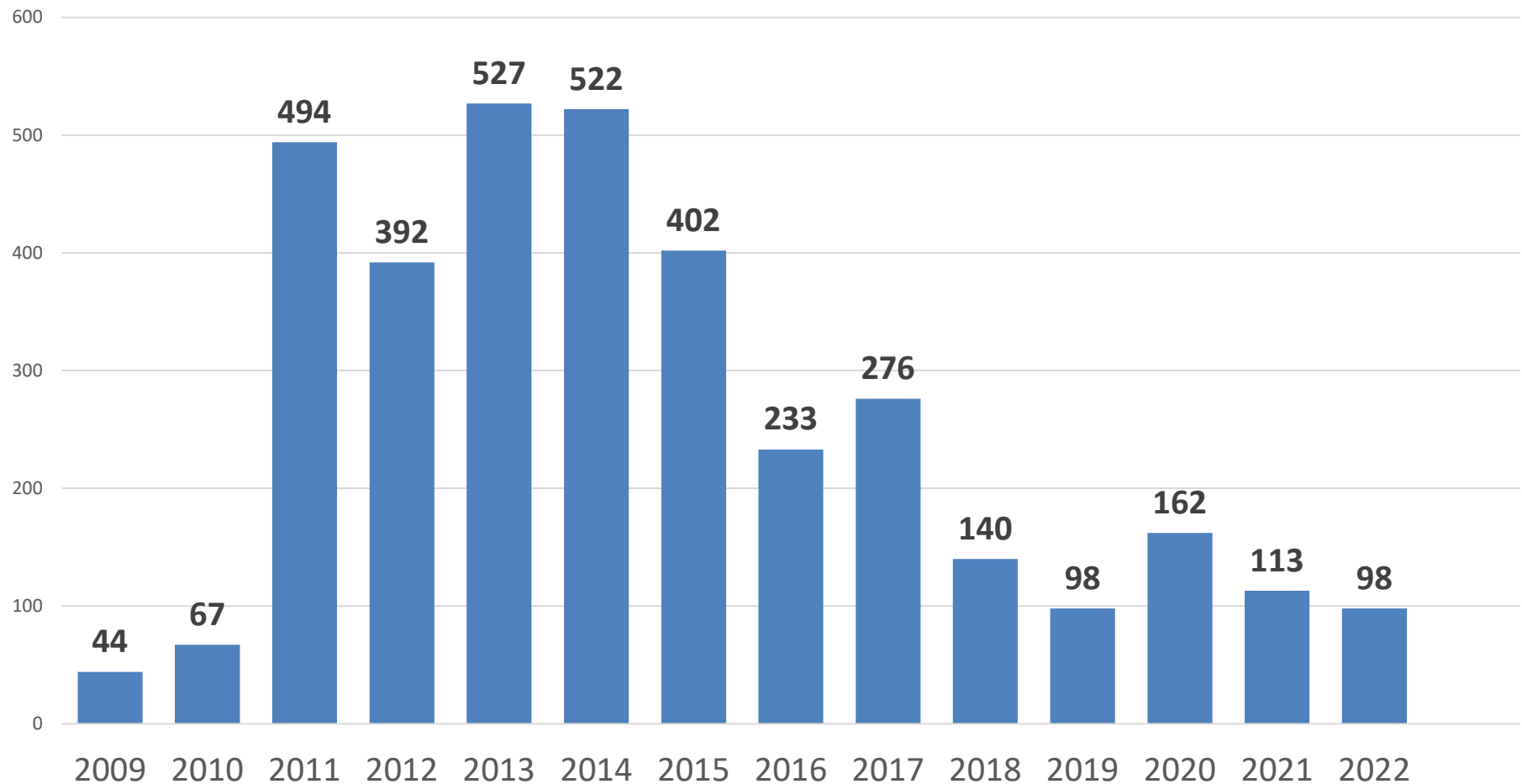

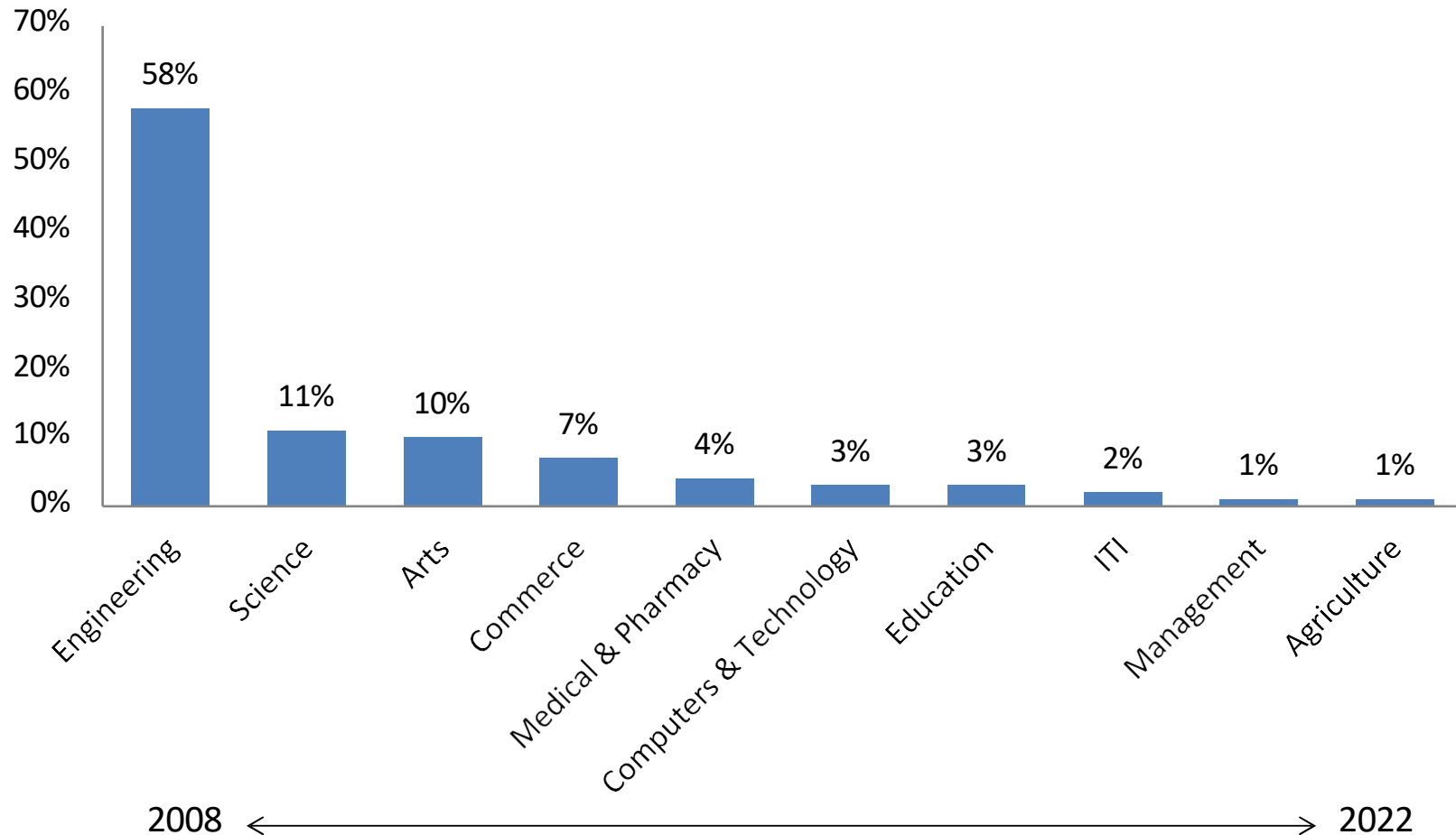
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Year wise Pass out beneficiaries from 2009 till 2022

Stream wise Scholarship given from 2008 till 2022



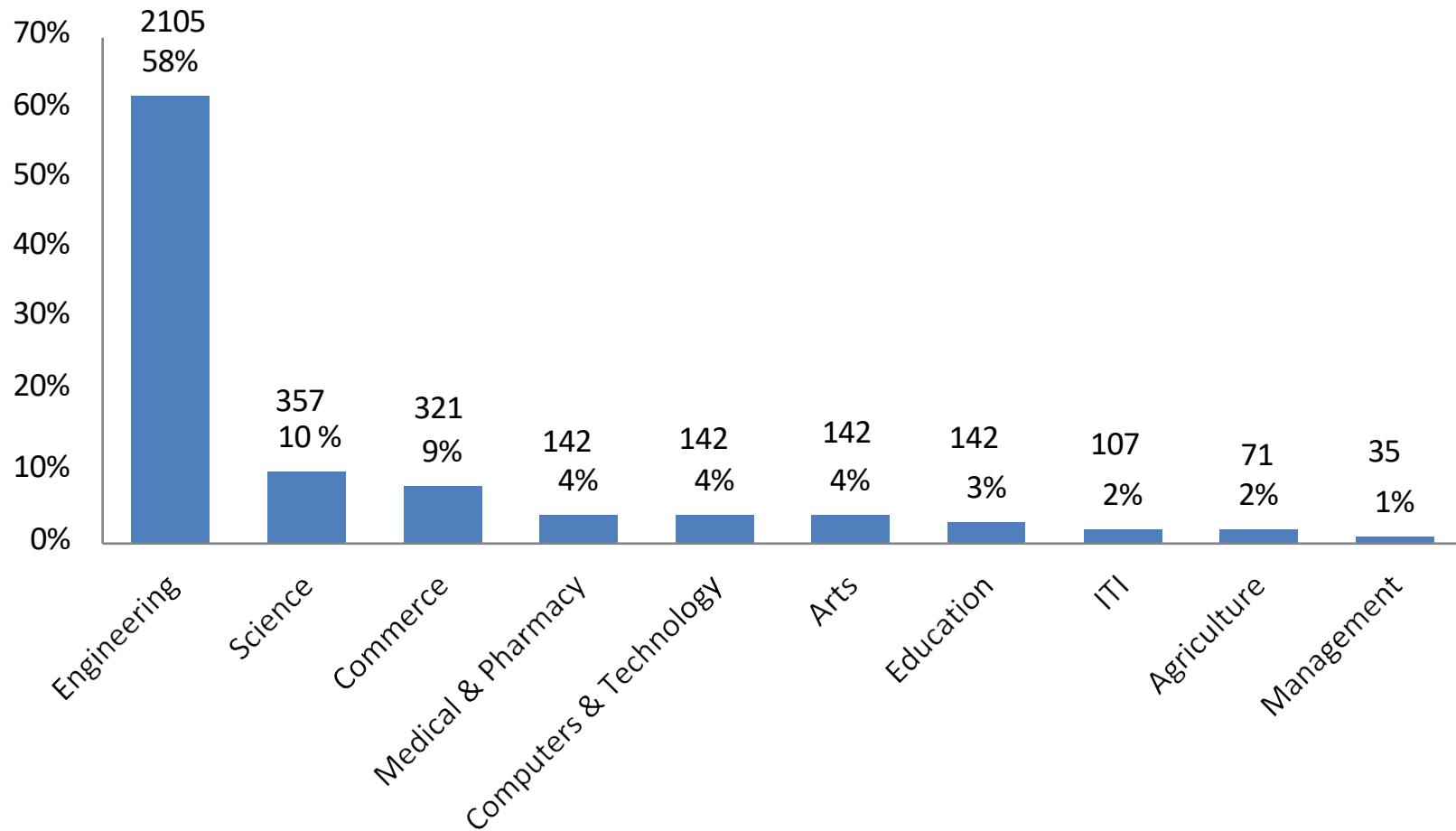
Highest Beneficiaries in Engineering stream
